The group arrived in Perth and were straight away rehearsing for their performance the following day. The students were also able to see the WA Symphony Orchestra in action on the Saturday night. For most students, this was a hugely informative and enjoyable experience.

Our annual Primary School Workshop was held in Week 9, led by Mr David Parkinson. For the first time, this event was held at Cape Naturaliste College, which is where Symph Band 3 rehearses. This was a great success with all of the GBM primary school students invited to attend. With over 130 students involved, it was a very busy but fruitful day. It was also an opportunity for the Classical Guitar students to have their debut performance. This group was led by Miss Fiona Lemon and is sure to grow over the coming years.

We farewelled our Year 12 students with the BSHS Presentation evening and the GBM Senior Concert. Symph Band 1 and Jazz 1 performed at both of these events, with Soul Band performing at the Senior Concert. This latter event also allowed for the final solo performances of our Year 12 students, as well as showcasing the Year 11 ATAR students as soloists. It was a great way to say bon voyage and good luck to our Seniors and we wish them all the best in their future endeavours. These ensembles have now had an influx of new members with lower school students now having started rehearsing with Symph 1 in Week 4. More invitations may be coming out for eligible students as the year progresses and it will be great to see these students rise to the challenge of more difficult music.

We have two official events left this year. The first is the IMSS Parent Information evening for the parents of those students who intend to enter GBM in 2022. This will be held on the Monday of Week 8 (24<sup>th</sup> November) starting at 5:30pm in the BSHS PAC. Any parent who has a child entering either the high school or primary school programme, is welcome to come along to this session. Everything to do with the IMSS programme will be covered and will be a great opportunity to have any queries cleared up.

Our final event will be the Sundowner, which will be a showcase of our lower school and primary students. This event will be held at BSHS on the Year 8 quadrangle. Last year's event was a great success and a really enjoyable evening. This year's Sundowner will follow the same format with the Support Group providing food and drinks for sale. There will also be a fundraising raffle with great prizes so bring along some cash to get tickets and nourishment. We arrived at Point Walter recreation camp around 11am, greeted by a beautiful scenic view of the Swan river. The afternoon was spent rehearsing the music to put the final touches in place for the performance on Saturday. Thanks to David Parkinson for also meeting us at the camp and



assisting with the rehearsals. In the evening, we took the students to Churchlands SHS see some of the other schools that were performing at the band festival in division B and C. This gave everyone a good idea of the venue, workshop format and the layout of the stage in preparation for the performance on Saturday. On Saturday morning we all went for a wonderful walk down by the river before launching into more rehearsal time prior to the performance. When we arrived at Churchlands SHS, the nerves were high, but the Geographe Bay Music students presented themselves on stage with professionalism and aplomb, and presented a great performance of three pieces for the audience and adjudicators. The band then enjoyed a short workshop on stage with Dale Pointon, one of the adjudicators in which gems of musical wisdom were imparted. After some rest and sport time back at the camp, the students were then treated to a night out to see the West Australian Symphony Orchestra perform a concert of great works including Shostakovich's 5<sup>th</sup> Symphony! The students represented the two high schools with professionalism and respect, and all the students made new friends across the two campuses and thoroughly enjoyed the camp experience, arriving back at school enthused and reinvigorated.
